

ROBERT A. GABLE, PhD by Robin Sweitzer

Robert A. Gable, PhD, born February 1, 1944, in Lancaster,

Pennsylvania, is a leading scholar in the field of special, or

exceptional, education. He is best known for his work to improve the
education of children with behavior disorders. He has written

several book chapters and professional journal articles in addition to editing leading scholarly journals. He is the Constance F. and Colgate W. Darden professor and eminent scholar at <u>Old Dominion University</u> in Norfolk, Virginia.

Academic Career

Gable obtained his undergraduate degree in art education from Pennsylvania's <u>Kutztown</u>

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University in 1966 (Cook, Guidara & Williams, 2006). While teaching art at Allentown State Hospital, he developed an interest in special education (R.A. Gable, personal communication, November 2, 2009). In 1970, Gable took a position as Director of Education at Friendship House, a residential and day treatment facility for children and adolescents with emotional and behavioral disorders, in Scranton, PA. During this time, he continued his education at Marywood University where he obtained a master's degree in special education in 1973. His education specialist and doctoral degree was earned from the George Peabody College for Teachers of Vanderbilt University, Nashville, TN, in 1977. He was on the special education faculty of Peabody College from 1977-1978. Following his time at Vanderbilt, Gable accepted a position as Director of Education at the National Children's Rehabilitation Center, a residential facility in northern Virginia, from 1979-1984. He was on the education faculty of the University of

<u>Pittsburgh</u> from 1982-1984 before taking a position at <u>Old Dominion</u> University in1984. He was named an eminent scholar at ODU in 1994 ("Faculty awards", 2005).

Professional Interests and Achievements

For over thirty years, Gable has written over 250 journal articles, monographs, books and textbook chapters on teacher training, assessment measures, behavioral interventions and treatment advances in special needs or at risk children (Cook, et.al., 2006).

He was President of the <u>Council for Children with Behavioral Disorders</u> (CCBD) from 2003 to 2004 (R.A. Gable, personal communication, November 2, 2009). In addition to serving on the editorial board of numerous professional journals, Gable has been Consulting Editor of *Behavioral Disorders* since 1980 and of *Teacher Education and Special Education* since 1988. He has been the Executive Editor of *Preventing School Failure* since 1990. He is also a Research Fellow with the American Institute of Research in Washington, D.C. ("Robert A. Gable, PhD", n.d.).

In addition to his scholarly contributions, Gable has also made significant achievements in research and intervention implementation. Gable, individually and with his colleagues, has been granted over \$25 million dollars from private foundations, the <u>Virginia Department of Education</u>, and the <u>United States Department of Education</u> toward these efforts ("Robert A. Gable, PhD", n.d.). In 1995 he received ODU's faculty Outstanding University Researcher Award followed by the Rufus Tonelson Distinguished Faculty Award in 2005 (Cook, et.al., 2006). He was co-awarded the

Christa McAuliffe Award for Excellence in Teaching in 2005 from the <u>American</u>

<u>Association of State Colleges and Universities</u>. Kutztown University awarded him with the Rothermel Alumni Award in 2006 ("Academic," 2006).

Working closely with the Commonwealth of Virginia's Department of Education, Gable was a leader in the implementation of such programs in the state's educational system as the Training and Technical Assistance Center (T-TAC) and Commonwealth Special Education Endorsement Program (CSEEP). T-TAC is a statewide program providing training and technical assistance to educators in order to enhance the education of children with disabilities ("Thirty years," 2009). CSEEP is a program at Old Dominion University funded by a grant from Virginia's department of education to offer reduced tuition to special education teachers wishing to achieve full licensure (Commonwealth Special Education Endorsement Program Team, 2005). He is also director of the commonwealth's initiative, Effective School-wide Discipline (ESD). ESD essentially is Virginia's version of Positive Behavior Intervention and Support (PBIS). ESD helps teachers in classroom inclusion settings come together in their schools to discuss problems and procedural changes.
